

In 1931, the Western Pacific Railroad built a branch running north from a wye at Keddie to Bieber, California, where it met the Great Northern Railway, which had built south from Klamath Falls, Oregon. The new route from Klamath Falls to Keddie was dubbed the "Inside Gateway."

Near Lodgepole, California, the WP portion of the Inside Gateway runs through lake and marsh country on flat basalt flows.
